- General Conference, originally scheduled for 2020, has again been postponed another year; a virtual General Conference was considered but deemed not feasible due to the lack of reliable internet on the African continent, and the lack of vaccine availability outside a relative handful of countries. Groups desirous of changes to church policy toward the LGBT community are disappointed that the conference cannot be held, but they understand that it is essentially impossible to hold a fair General Conference in 2021.
- Melissa MacKinnon is being re-assigned from the East District Superintendency to the North, and we will be assigned Rev. Dr. Siosaia "Saia" Tu'itahi (*pictured*), late of Santa Ana UMC. Rev. Saia is the first Pacific Islander DS to serve stateside, and is married to Monalisa Tu'itahi, who has been elected a lay delegate to the General Conference.



- Both the District Conference (in May) and the Annual Conference (in June) will be held virtually this year, as they were in 2020, though they will be able to be held in person in 2022.
- Bishop Hagiya continues to issue statements on the pressing issues that have beset the country and world. In particular, he issued a strong statement in response to acts of violence against members of the Asian-American community.
